A Story of Hope



Cat & Dan's Story

Tina our Community Outreach Adviser first met Cat & Dan in October 2017 when they were desperately worried about enforcement agents (who used to be called bailiffs) knocking on their door. They had a considerable number of debts despite both working and trying to juggle looking after their 3 young children (all under the age of 8) and 2 cats. They were overcrowded in poor housing with mould and damp issues and were all very downhearted and stressed.

During the course of the next 8 months we managed to stop the enforcement agents taking action and negotiate re-payment plans for council tax and rent arrears. We also helped them to set up re-payment plans with their other creditors as well as delivering food parcels with nappies when times were hard. We treated the family to a pantomime outing at Christmas and a food hamper.

By the end of June 2018, Tina had visited the family to see how things were progressing and were pleased to hear that they had managed to get on top of their finances and as a result had moved to a bigger house in a new area which was more suitable for them as a family. Dan now has a new better paid job and has given up smoking in a deliberate attempt to look after his family, his own health and budget better. Both Cat and Dan are now much happier. Dan said: 'the help from Reach has been amazing, Tina has gone way above and beyond.... it's meant that we could tackle our problems and it got us where we wanted to be - in a new home and on top of our finances.'
